WHAT DOES TEXAS PARTNERS BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depends on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Social Security Number and Account Information ▪ Payment History and Transaction History ▪ Investment Experience and Risk Tolerance
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information and the reasons Texas Partners Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do

How does Texas Partners Bank protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

We also maintain other physical, electronic and procedures safeguards to protect this information as we have limited access to information to those employees for whom access is appropriate.

How does Texas Partners Bank collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- Open an account or apply for a loan
- Give us your contact information or show us your driver's license
- Seek advice about your investments

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- Affiliates from using your information to market to you
- Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.

What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?

Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- Our affiliates are Southwest Bancshares, Inc and all companies including Texas Partners Bank; The Bank of San Antonio Insurance Group; Aspireon Wealth Advisors, LLC; Aspireon Investment Management, LLC; Aspireon Opportunities Fund GP, Inc; and Texas Express Funding, LLC.

Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- Texas Partners Bank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.

Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- Joint marketing partners allow us to offer products and services such as credit cards and other financial investments, products and services.

For Texas Bank Customers: Texas Partners Bank is chartered under the laws of the State of Texas and by state law is subject to regulatory oversight by the Texas Department of Banking.
